Tips for parents who are not married and/or are living apart

Unmarried parents



During pregnancy or after birth

Acknowledgement of paternity

NOTE In the event that parents are not married, the law says that the person who acknowledges paternity is the father, insofar as the mother agrees.

- Youth welfare office (Jugendamt) or registry office (Standesamt) (free)
- Notary (subject to charges)
- German Consulates

Unmarried parents who agree about their joint custody



During pregnancy or after birth

Declaration of agreed joint custody by making agreed custody statement

NOTE This statement can be made as part of the acknowledgement of paternity or at a later date.

- Notary (subject to charges)

Parents living apart



After birth

Child maintenance

Cash maintenance for the child is payable by the parent who is not the primary caregiver (insofar as this parent is capable of paying).

NOTE The <u>C</u> <u>Düsseldorfer Tabelle</u> forms the basis for determining the amount of child maintenance.

TIP The youth welfare office (Jugend-amt) offers advice regarding child maintenance issues and helps find a mutually acceptable solution.

Single parents who do not get any or regular child maintenance, or when paternity is not clear

Unmarried parents living apart

Parental maintenance

Parental maintenance is payable by the parent who is not the child's primary caregiver (insofar as this parent is capable of paying).

Unmarried fathers and mothers who are looking after their child can claim parental maintenance from the other parent for at least three years after the child's birth.

A parent with sole custody or a parent with joint custody who has the child for the majority of the time, if there are open questions concerning paternity and/or maintenance



Fathers who want joint custody in the event that the mother does not agree

Application for legal representation for the child

A legal representative (Beistand) here is a person who represents the child alongside the parent and who advises parents on determining paternity and sorting out maintenance questions.

Application for custody

Note The family court will give parents joint custody if this does not conflict with the wellbeing of the child. If the mother does not produce any reasons against joint custody and if such reasons are not otherwise apparent, then the legal presumption is that joint parental custody will not conflict with the wellbeing of the child.
